Booking:

There is a limit of 50 people at each Mass and so we have put a booking system in place.

YOU MUST BOOK A PLACE BEFORE YOU COME TO MASS.

1. **Eventbrite** – For online booking follow these links: [St John the Baptist](#) or [St Kentigern](#). Only book multiple tickets for a single household who will sit together. You must enter the name of each individual person in the booking. If you are booking for someone else please make a separate booking for each household. Name and contact details for each booking must be supplied. Booking opens on Monday 9am for the following week. Booking ends 2 hours before each Mass starts.
2. **Telephone** – If you do not have internet you can book a place by calling Marlene McCallum on 07748 817878 (10am-8pm). You will be asked to give your name, address and phone number.

Here is what to expect when you come to church for Mass:

- Volunteers will be at church to welcome and assist you. Please follow their guidance.
- All are asked to wear face-coverings in the church except children under 5 years of age.
- Please sanitise hands on entry and exit using the dispensers provided. A volunteer will guide you to the designated seating which maintains 2m social distancing. Please only sit where the welcomers direct you to.
- The Liturgy is adapted for brevity. At the end of Mass, Communion will be distributed under one kind, on the hand. After receiving Communion you are asked to leave the church directly.
- If you are not receiving Communion and prefer not to come forward for a blessing please ask to be seated in the back pews and exit directly after the final blessing. At St Kentigern's you may exit via the entrance.

Those with underlying health conditions requiring shielding and long-term health conditions requiring a flu jab should follow Scottish Government guidelines in deciding whether to come to church or not.

If you have any Covid-19 symptoms (fever, cough, loss of smell or taste), PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE CHURCHES. Thank you for your cooperation.

In the Sunday readings this week ...

To be entrusted with someone else's keys is an honour and privilege that entails great responsibility. This symbolism is invoked as Eliakim is chosen to replace Shebna as the master of the palace of the House of David. In assuming this authority, Eliakim is called to be a 'father' who cares for the people and to act like a 'peg' that holds everything together. Jesus summons this imagery when he gives Simon the keys of the kingdom of heaven making him master of the palace of the whole People of God. In receiving a new name, Peter is set apart for a special purpose in God's plan. He is to become the father and peg of Jesus' church. He is the first Pope, or 'papa', 'father' of the church whose care for the people and unifying authority is shared by each of his successors.

Justice & Peace Mass: The annual Justice and Peace Mass takes place on the **Day of Creation, 1st September**, at St Columba's in Edinburgh. There will be 50 spaces available. The Mass and further details will be promoted on the Archdiocesan website and social media shortly.

Pregnancy support: The Archdiocese is looking to set up a pregnancy support service. On **5th September 10.30am**, the Pro-Life Office will host an online meeting for anyone who would like to contribute ideas and support. Corstorphine Community Centre - is running an **Emergency Foodbank** to support people who find themselves without enough money to purchase food. They are now finding it difficult to obtain sufficient stock to meet the demand. They are seeking packets of cereal, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, soup mix and stockcubes, packets of rice, tinned and packet deserts and tinned fruit. Donations should be taken to the Corstorphine Community Centre Hub (in St Johns' Road in the block once occupied by Woolworths) on Wednesday mornings 10am-12noon when the Hub is open with volunteers on duty to receive donations. It is important that donations are not left out with this time as they will not be used in case they have been contaminated.
