Booking: There is a limit of 50 people at each Mass and so we have put a booking system in place.

Here is what to expect when you come to church for Mass:

- Volunteers will be at church to welcome and assist you. Please follow their guidance.
- > All are asked to wear face-coverings in the church except children under 5 years of age.
- Please sanitise hands on entry and exit using the dispensers provided. A volunteer will guide you to the designated seating which maintains 2m social distancing. Please only sit where the welcomers direct you to.
- Change to procedure for distribution of Holy Communion: in response to a number of comments and requests I will trial distributing Communion in the pews which will allow people to kneel or sit in reverence after receiving the Blessed Sacrament. If you are receiving, please put out your hands as I pass along the empty pews. After Communion, Mass will finish as usual and then the passkeepers will direct you to leave the church as currently.

If you have any Covid-19 symptoms (fever, cough, loss of smell or taste), PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE CHURCHES.

In the Sunday readings this week ...

Jesus tells a parable of two sons. One says he will not work in the vineyard when asked to by his father but then thinks better of it and does. The other says he will but then fails to back up his words with action. Jesus commends the first one, the one who does (eventually) the father's will. The action God the Father is asking of all people is to repent and enter the kingdom of heaven and Jesus gives the example of the tax collectors and prostitutes who believed and responded to the call of John the Baptist by seeking to reform their lives. All people are invited to renounce sin "to become law-abiding and honest" and so enter the eternal realm of the kingdom of God. We must remember that, in the matter of repentance, actions speak louder than words.

Bethany Catering Teams – Parish Catering Nights Confirmed: Our parish has offered to support the Bethany Overnight Welcome Centre for their forthcoming season to respond to the homelessness crisis on our city. Bethany will be providing their overnight shelter and support services from Monday 5 October 2020 to Sunday 2 May 2021. At this stage we have offered to provide catering teams for two nights: Wednesday 4th November and Thursday 17th December. The hope is that depending on response from parishioners, we might be able to offer more than these two initial evenings, and we'll update on this as soon as we can.

Foodbanks: The pressure on Foodbanks is greater now than ever. Donations of non-perishable food items, household cleaning products and toiletries all needed and can be left in the baskets provided in the respective churches. Your support for families in crisis, particularly at this time, is very much appreciated.

Parish Charitable Support: during these difficult and challenging times the demand for charitable services is greater than ever. It is important that we as a Christian community look outward to the need that arises around us and respond as best we can.
