Sunday Readings: The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light. Jesus comes to the shores of the Sea of Galilee and begins to preach, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' We see the in-breaking of heaven on earth as Jesus goes about preaching, teaching and curing the sick. Wherever he goes, the darkness of doubt, fear, ignorance and suffering are dispelled and people rejoice to be set free. We live in an age of great doubt, fear, ignorance of eternal things and suffering. The remedy is the same: repent and embrace Jesus as Lord. No earthly prince, ruler, pundit or influencer has the answer: they only cause more confusion and division among people. Paul warns the Corinthians not to seek salvation in Apollos, or Cephas, or even Paul himself but to seek only the salvation that comes through Christ crucified. This is the Good News that needs to be shared. This is the net that needs to be cast wide by disciples who share Jesus' desire that all people may see the light and be gathered into the kingdom of God. Jesus calls Peter, Andrew, James and John to join the mission. Is he calling you too to push out into the deep, and cast the net? Is he calling you to bear witness to his love today?
