**Sunday Readings:** Jesus prefaces his great Sermon on the Mount with his declaration of the beatitudes which is given in this Sunday's Gospel. The beatitudes are sometimes spoken of as Jesus' mission manifesto or sometimes as his blueprint for a people that he will form, lead and offer to God the Father. The Beatitudes are the values and virtues of heaven that invoke the blessing of God on earth and God's blessing is humanity's greatest happiness. God's blessing and human happiness abound wherever there is true humility, gentleness, active compassion for the sorrows of others, desire for justice, mercy, integrity of spirit, mind and body, peacefulness and brave endurance and steadfast faith in the face of persecution for the sake of Jesus. To live the beatitudes is to live in 'Jesus mode' instead of 'me mode'. We come to inhabit this mode of being not by our own efforts but by God's doing, who has made us *members of Christ Jesus* such that he has become our wisdom, virtue, holiness and freedom. Abide in the Lord and be free!
