**Sunday Readings:** "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world." Jesus gives us two images by which we are to contemplate how we should live, or be, in this world as his disciples. Salt is a preservative that stops things going rotten. It is also a flavour that brings out the best taste in food. We are called to be in the world praying, offering the Sacrifice of the Mass for the redemption of all people, preserving the presence of God whose love stops the rot in human souls and societies and brings out the best in people. Light is the means by which we see things clearly. We are called to lives of active love and compassion, sacrifice and joyful self-control that bear witness to a right relationship with God, that others may see clearly the goodness of our Father in heaven. In writing to the Corinthians, St Paul was acutely aware that anything he had to offer did not come from himself. He could not, would not, offer philosophical proofs and sophisticated argumentation in support of his preaching about Christ crucified. He could only demonstrate the power of the Holy Spirit working in him and through him. Any saltiness and luminescence that we have comes from the Father, through Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit.
