Sunday Readings: "I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven." By his life, death and resurrection, the Lord Jesus has united heaven and earth. By baptism, we are inserted into the life of grace that flows through Christ from on high. That grace, that 'living water', isn't meant to wash over us, but to flow into us and course through our veins and bring the life of heaven to our poor, sickly hearts. That living water is the Spirit, who 'reaches the depths of everything, even the depths of God.' Through Christ crucified, the Spirit comes from the depth of God's heart to the depths of ours. The motto on John Henry Cardinal Newman's Coat of Arms was *Cor ad cor loquitur* – 'heart speaks to heart' and that sums up so well the deeply personal nature of God's relationship with us.

Connected heart to heart, now God can speak to the root

causes of human sinfulness: the anger that leads to violence, the lust that leads to adultery, the weakness of character that makes and breaks false promises. 'The hidden wisdom of God', his gentle and loving whispering to our heart in the crucial moments before we act badly, leads us away from sin and death and towards life.
