Sunday Readings: On this 'Good Shepherd Sunday' each year we have a reading from John chapter 10 in which Jesus describes himself and his relationship with his people using the image of shepherd and sheep. He is the Good Shepherd whose sheep know and trust his voice. As a shepherd leads his sheep to places where they can find the best food and be safe, so Jesus leads his people to where they will be fully satisfied which is God. In today's Gospel Jesus describes himself as the gate of the sheepfold as a way of emphasizing that he is the Way to God the Father as well as the Truth and the Life. This Sunday is chosen as the Day of Prayer for Vocations because

'vocation' is essentially the call of the Good Shepherd to men and women to set out on the path that will lead them to the fullness of life in service of the Church. We pray today in a particular way for men and women to answer God's call to the priesthood and the religious life because we really need more of them. For all people though, we remember that love is the path to happiness and love is the gift of oneself to others. Our vocation is the call from God to follow the path by which he knows that we will be able to make the fullest and best gift of ourselves to others: in service of the people of God as a priest, in communities of love and prayer as a religious or to spouse and children in marriage and family life, or in chaste lives intentionally dedicated to the service of all. The Lord calls. May his people hear and heed his voice.
