Sunday Peadings: In our age of anyiety we need to receive anew the words of lesus				



**Sunday Readings:** In our age of anxiety we need to receive anew the words of Jesus in the Gospel today, 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me'. If we feel that we have lost the way, that we don't know what our purpose is or what we should be aiming for, we need to turn to Jesus and find that he is the Way. He reveals to us that we are loved by God and called to return to him as the source of all peace and joy and finally to come to rest there in the Father's house for blissful eternity. We think, like Thomas, that we can't find the way to God, we don't know the way but all we need do is turn to Jesus, hear and heed his teaching and follow his ways and that will set us on the right path. Like a compass needle that always points North, Jesus always points to the Father's house. Not only the Way, Jesus is the Truth and the Life. In our age of multiple worldviews and ideologies, religious enthusiasms, fake news and misinformation we crave to know the truth

with certainty. Believe in Jesus, trust in Jesus, that he is one with the one true God and his words are Truth. His words are Truth and they are Life. With Jesus we know the Way and the Truth and this frees us from the fear and anxiety, the sheer existential angst, that disables us from experiencing the Life of heavenly peace and joy that God wants us to have. This is the Good News that needs to be shared by the Church, 'the people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.'
