



Sunday Readings: The celebration of the Most Holy Trinity in this first year of the three year cycle of Sunday readings is focused on the inner reality, the inner essence, the inner life of God. At the heart of the Judaeo-Christian revelation is that God is love existing as a unity, a communion of three loving persons who are completely one in



their love for and with each other. The philosopher's God the ground of all being, the first cause and mover of reality, the Creator of all that is - is revealed in Scripture as the "God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness"; "the God of love and peace"; the God who "Loved the world so much that he gave his only Son", that "the world might be saved". The remote God of rational thought is revealed as loving Father, Son and Holy Spirit who invites us too, to become one with them. In the words of St Paul, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."
