Sunday Readings: If you could have anything you wanted from God, what would you ask for? Perhaps a genie who could



grant your every earthly wish? Silver and gold in abundance; long, healthy life; protection from all harm. There is a big part of us that thinks only of this life and desires it to be long and comfortable but the readings this Sunday point us towards a greater treasure which is the kingdom of heaven. Solomon pleases God by asking for 'a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil' and is rewarded with the gift of 'a heart wise and shrewd as none before'. Solomon's request is pleasing to God because it reveals Solomon's desire for God. Being able to discern the path of goodness through life is discerning the

path that leads to God. Solomon has chosen this before all else. In this

moment at least, Solomon is like the person in Jesus' parables who has found the treasure in the field or the pearl of great price and is willing to give up everything else for it's sake. The path that leads to God is not always the path of earthly riches and comfort. God's plan and purpose for those who seek him is that they 'become true images of his Son' as St Paul tells the Romans in the second reading. In growing likeness to the Son under the guidance and power of the Spirit souls are directed towards the Father and his heavenly kingdom. Growing likeness to the Son requires lifting the Cross with him during this life and that's our fundamental choice. Take up the Cross and seek the kingdom or seek the reward of riches and comfort here and now. Jesus' parable of fishermen sorting the good catch from the bad in the dragnet reminds us that we will ultimately be judged according to how we have responded to that ultimate choice.
