<u>Sunday readings</u>: Everybody loves a wedding! A man and a woman committing to a lifetime of faithful and fruitful love together before God and their families and friends. And then the wedding feast that follows with great food and drink and dancing. A wedding embodies so much of what human beings are capable of in terms of love, faithfulness, joy, mutual support and service, loyalty, family and community. Little wonder then, that on several occasions, Jesus used the image of a wedding feast to describe the kingdom of God. Jesus' point in telling the parable of the wedding feast in today's Gospel is that God has something very wonderful in mind for human flourishing and he invites all people to share in it, "good and bad alike". The invitation is to <u>all</u>. Sin can be forgiven, so sinners too can enter the kingdom as long as they put on the garments of repentance and accept the grace of God. All are invited but each must choose to accept the invitation and observe the dress code.

**Synod Prayer:** Archbishop Cushley encourages us to pray for the success of the Synod of Bishops, which is taking place in Rome throughout October: We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.
