Our monthly food collection will resume on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month beginning Sunday **4<sup>th</sup> February**. A list of general items of non-perishable food, toiletries and household products is displayed on the notice board. But <u>urgently required items</u> are – UHT milk, long life fruit juice, cereal, pasta sauce/curry sauce, ready meals (e.g. pot noodles, cheesy pasta) rice and jam and tinned cold meat, fruit, custards/rice pudding, spaghetti in sauce, vegetables. Please leave your donation in the baskets provided in both churches. Last year (January-October) St Kentigern's Sunday Teas donations of £595.30 bought goods delivered direct to the Foodbank. Many thanks to the Sunday tea/coffee drinkers and all who contributed with their donations.
