Sunday Readings: "There was a Jewish leader named Nicodemus, who belonged to the party of the Pharisees. One night he went to Jesus..." These words, which don't appear in the Gospel passage we have for this Sunday, set the scene for Jesus' teaching that we hear today. "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life." Under the cover of darkness, Nicodemus is drawn to the light. At the end of John's Gospel Nicodemus is the one who helps Joseph of Arimathea wrap Jesus' body and lay it in the tomb. The light that he encountered on that dark night has opened his eyes to the truth and led him to become a follower of Jesus. We pray for the light of Christ to open the eyes of all those who walk in darkness to the love, joy and peace of God.
