Palm Sunday Readings: Jesus enters Jerusalem on a donkey to the cheers and adulation of his followers who wave palm branches heralding the Son of David who has come to set his people free. Before long the crowds of the holy city are baying for his blood in front of Pilate, screaming, 'Crucify him!'. The Lord remains obedient to the will of his Father throughout, that the world may know that the Father sent him for love of the world and that all may be saved.





'His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross.' (Philippians 2:6-11)

<u>HOLY WEEK</u> - The liturgies of this most sacred time of the Christian year follow our Lord as he descends from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem and the institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Lord's Supper, through betrayal, arrest and trial to death on a cross and finally to the glory of his Resurrection.

- Holy Monday: 7.00pm St John the Baptist, Mass followed by Adoration and Confessions.
- Holy Tuesday: 9.30am St Kentigern's, Mass + Stations; 7.00pm St Mary's Cathedral. Chrism Mass. This is a lovely occasion when the priests of the diocese in the presence of the community renew their priestly promises and the Archbishop blesses the oils of Catechumens, Chrism and Infirmorum (sick) to be distributed to all of the parishes for use during the year. All are welcome to attend.
