Sunday Readings: In the Gospel, the scribes attribute Jesus' power to cast out demons to the work of Satan. They thus perceive goodness as evil which is a complete corruption of the heart. In his encyclical on the Holy Spirit (*Dominum et vivificantem*), Pope Saint John Paul II explained that the blasphemy against the Holy Spirit "does not properly consist in offending against the Holy Spirit in words; it consists rather in the refusal to accept the salvation which God offers man through the Holy Spirit, working through the power of the Cross...It is the sin committed by the person who claims to have a 'right' to persist in evil – in any sin at all – and who thus rejects Redemption." The catechism adds: "There are no limits to the mercy of God, but anyone who deliberately refuses to accept his mercy by repenting, rejects the forgiveness of his sins and the salvation offered by the Holy Spirit. Such hardness of heart can lead to final impenitence and eternal loss" (CCC 1864).
