**Sunday Readings:** Jesus spoke in parables, "He would not speak to them except in parables..." according to the Gospel of Mark. The parables are not riddles or puzzles to be solved, they are stories and images that are meant to be meditated upon, pondered in our hearts, so that God can speak to us through them.

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses images of seed being sown and growing to produce a visible crop and of the smallest seed becoming the largest of shrubs. They are meant to help the Lord's hearers reflect on the kingdom of God.

A farmer cooperates with the natural potential of nature. He or she doesn't make things grow by his or her own power, but simply works to bring seed and earth together and leaves nature to do the rest. Perhaps we need to think of ourselves as disciples, in a similar way. We cannot make disciples of others by our own power but we can work to bring people into contact with God by suggestion, example, the offering of prayers, testimony to the love we know. Remaining faithful to our mission to bear witness to Jesus, we then must simply trust in God and let him bring these seeds mysteriously to fruition. By his grace, even our most seemingly feeble and insignificant efforts at sharing the love of God can achieve great things.
