A message from Fr Jamie: As you might remember, the Christmas story begins with the Holy Family travelling to Bethlehem to take part in the census decreed by Caesar Augustus. We're not quite at Christmas yet but this weekend we're taking part in a census of our own – the Archbishop has asked us to count the number of people attending each Mass, in each church, to be sent to Rome for analysis of trends throughout the Catholic world. Thank you very much to the pass-keepers for taking a note of these numbers, and for all their hard work providing a warm welcome to Mass each week. Since we're in the census spirit, I'd be grateful to you if you would also take a few minutes to fill in a parish registration form – this form has been recently updated by the Parish Pastoral Council and will be a great resource in helping me to get to know you a bit more quickly, as well as making sure that our records are accurate and up to date. So, whether you've been coming to Mass here since the parish was founded or if, like me, you're a more recent addition – please take five minutes to fill in a registration form! I'll be very grateful. Finally, as we come into the month of November I thought it would be nice for us to take time at the end of each Mass to say a prayer for those – family members, friends, fellow parishioners – who have died. We'll use the traditional prayer for the dead from the funeral liturgy – if you don't know it, this might be a good prayer to commit to memory and pray at home as a family during this month: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them: may they rest in peace. Amen."

Please pray for:

- The sick and the housebound of the parish, especially Katherine Boyle, Terry Boyce and Lily Webber: that the Lord will grant them healing, comfort and strength.
- All those who died, especially those who have died recently, those whose anniversaries occur at this time and those who have no-one else to pray for them. May they rest in peace and rise in glory!

READINGS FOR SUNDAY MASS

First Reading:

Deuteronomy 6: 2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord the God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: the Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

Responsorial Psalm:

Psalm 17 (18): 2-4, 47, 51

The response is: I love you, Lord, my strength.

Second Reading:

Hebrews 7: 23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!

Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life; you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

Gospel:

Mark 12: 28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
