A message from Fr Jamie: Friends, today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. St John the Baptist distinguishes his baptism of repentance ("with water") from the transformational baptism of the Christian dispensation ("with the Holy Spirit and fire"). Christ's acceptance of a baptism of repentance speaks to his willingness to share in our fallen human nature; the baptism he himself brings will raise us up to share in his divine nature. Pope Leo the Great (400-461), in one of his Christmas sermons, describes this as a "wonderful exchange" and he says, "O Christian, remember your dignity!" Fifteen centuries later, the Second Vatican Council placed great emphasis on the baptismal vocation of every Christian and the universal call to holiness and to mission that follows from it. As we celebrate the Lord's baptism, may the powerful fire of his Holy Spirit which we received on the day of our baptisms be rekindled in our hearts and souls today! One of the newest members of our parish, Sam, will receive that great gift during Mass at St Kentigern's this weekend – this will give the whole community an opportunity to share in this joyful moment with his family, and participate in this reminder and renewal of our own baptismal calling.

## CHILDREN'S LITURGY AT ST KENTIGERN'S RESUMES THIS WEEKEND

With the new school term underway, the children's liturgy group at St Kentigern's resumes this weekend. Mike, the coordinator of the group, offers the following description of what happens: "Children's liturgy takes place in the parish room or in the hall most Sundays outside of school holidays. The subject of the day's gospel is introduced and presented in a child-friendly way, with a few reflections and some art/colouring in. It is available for children aged 3 and above, toilet trained, and for those doing sacramental preparation on Sundays when there is no sacramental preparation meeting happening. It is useful if at least one parent can come along as one other adult must be present in addition to the liturgy leader.
