A MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP CUSHLY: "On Sunday 30 March there will be a special collection at all parishes for Episcopal Papal 87 Charities (including SCIAF). 75 per cent of the collection goes to SCIAF and 25 per cent to the Archdiocesan Care Fund.
