"Lent: A Time To Reflect, Repent and Restore" Dear People of God, as we enter the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the Gospel presents one of the most powerful encounters with Jesus—His mercy toward the woman caught in adultery (John 8:1-11). The religious leaders bring her before Him, expecting condemnation, but instead, Jesus offers forgiveness and new life. His words, "*Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore,*" reveal the heart of our Lenten journey: repentance, transformation, and grace.

Lent is a time of renewal, a season to allow God's mercy to reshape our hearts. Like the woman in the Gospel, we, too, have fallen short. We carry burdens of sin, shame, and regret. Yet, Jesus does not cast stones—He extends love and calls us to a deeper conversion.

The First Reading (Isaiah 43:16-21) reminds us that God is always doing something new, making a way in the desert, offering streams of living water. No matter our past, He is leading us forward. St. Paul, in the Second Reading (Philippians 3:8-14), urges us to forget what lies behind and press on toward the prize of eternal life in Christ.

This Sunday invites us to surrender to God's mercy, to release judgment of ourselves and others, and to embrace the newness of life that Jesus offers. As we near Holy Week, may we step forward with hearts open to forgiveness, trusting that God's grace is greater than our sins. His love renews and restores us.
