"Easter Sunday: "He Is Risen, Indeed!"

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! This Easter morning, our hearts echo the ancient and ever-new proclamation of joy: He is not here; He is risen, just as He said! (Matthew 28:6). After the long journey through Lent, after the sorrow of Good Friday and the silence of Holy Saturday, we rise with Christ into the light of new life. Today is not just a celebration of an event long ago—it is the very heart of our faith, pulsing with hope, bursting with promise.

In a world that so often feels weighed down by darkness, division, and despair, Easter breaks through with radiant light. The empty tomb stands as God's loudest "Yes!" to humanity—yes to life over death, hope over fear, mercy over sin. And this is not a distant miracle—it is personal. It is here. It is now. Christ's resurrection is not simply His victory—it is our victory. *In Him, we are made new*.

This morning, we gather as a parish family—different faces, different stories, yet one in the Body of Christ. And together we are invited to become *Easter people*: people who live not from a place of fear, but from the abundance of God's redeeming love. People who know that no tomb is too sealed, no night too long, no heart too far gone for the risen Christ to reach.

So, what do we do with Easter? *We proclaim it. We live it.* We carry it into our homes, our workplaces, our schools, our streets. We forgive with the grace we have received. We serve with the love that was poured out for us. We walk forward, not looking back at the grave, but ahead with the joy of resurrection.

Let this Easter be more than a celebration—let it be a transformation. Let us rise with Christ and never look back – *Let us be Radiant! Alleluia, alleluia! He is risen indeed!*
