My dear People of God, on this 7th Sunday of Easter, we are invited into one of the most intimate and powerful moments in the life of Jesus—His prayer not just for His disciples, but for you and me. In the Gospel of John, Jesus prays: "I *pray not only for these, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one...*" (John 17:20–21) What an astonishing thought: before His Passion, Jesus had you in His heart. He saw the Church of every generation. He saw your struggles, your hopes, your longing to follow Him. And His deepest desire? Unity. "That they may all be one.."

Unity is Not Uniformity: Jesus doesn't ask the Father to make us identical or to erase our differences. Rather, He prays that despite all diversity, we may be united in love, in truth, and in mission. In a world that often divides by race, politics, class, or opinion, Christ calls us to a deeper communion—one grounded in one faith, one Baptism and one Lord!

A Witness to the World: Jesus says this unity is not just for our own peace—"so that the world may believe that you sent me." When the world sees Christians loving one another, working together, forgiving one another—it becomes a powerful witness to the reality of Jesus. Division weakens our witness. Love, faith and hope strengthen it.

The Glory of Love: Jesus speaks of glory—not earthly glory, but the glory of divine love. He wants us to share in that love, to dwell in it, and to radiate it. This is not a distant theological idea; it is a lived experience through prayer, the sacraments, and our service to others.

As we approach *Pentecost*, let us join with the early Church in the Upper Room—waiting and praying for the Spirit. Let us also join Jesus in His prayer for unity. Ask yourself this week:

- Where am I called to be a peacemaker?
- Where do I need to forgive or seek forgiveness?
- How can I contribute to the unity of my family, parish, and/or community?

May we live the prayer of Christ: "That they may all be one, as You, Father, are in Me and I in You." Come, Holy Spirit, and make us truly one.
