My dear People of God, today we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a feast that invites us to see the Cross not as a symbol of shame or defeat, but as the sign of God's greatest victory. In the eyes of the world, the Cross was an instrument of suffering and death. Yet in Christ, it has become the throne of love, the bridge between heaven and earth, and the source of our salvation.

In the Gospel (John 3:13–17), Jesus speaks of being "lifted up" so that all who believe may have eternal life. Just as Moses lifted the bronze serpent in the desert for healing, so too Christ is lifted on the Cross to heal the wounds of sin. The Cross, then, is not only a past event—it continues to be the place where we find healing, forgiveness, and new life.

Saint Paul reminds us that Jesus humbled Himself, becoming obedient unto death, and because of this, God highly exalted Him (Philippians 2:6–11). Exaltation flows from humility, and glory is revealed through sacrifice. The Cross shows us the paradox of Christian life: to lose is to gain, to die is to live, to serve is to reign.

For our parish, this feast is an invitation to embrace our daily crosses—our struggles, sacrifices, and trials—not as burdens that crush us, but as moments where Christ unites us to His redemptive love. The Cross teaches us to trust when life feels heavy, to forgive when hurt, and to hope when darkness surrounds us.

As we venerate the Cross today, let us lift high not just a symbol of wood, but the living truth it represents: that love is stronger than death, and that every cross carried with Christ becomes a pathway to resurrection.
