My dear People of God, in today's Gospel (Luke 17:5–10), the apostles ask Jesus, "*Increase our faith*." It is a prayer that echoes in every heart, especially when life feels overwhelming. Jesus responds with a striking image: even faith as small as a mustard seed has the power to uproot trees. True faith is not about quantity but about trust—placing our whole confidence in God, who makes the impossible possible.

Yet, Jesus immediately links faith to *humility*. He tells the parable of the servant who, after fulfilling his duty, does not expect praise but simply says, "We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." Faith, then, is not about demanding rewards from God but about serving Him with love, gratitude, and humility. The first reading (Habakkuk 1:2–3; 2:2–4) reassures us: though trials may test us, "the just one, because of his faith, shall live." Saint Paul, in the second reading (2 Timothy 1:6–8, 13–14), urges us to rekindle the gift of God's Spirit within us—a Spirit of courage, not fear.

For our parish, today's readings remind us that faith is both a gift and a daily choice. We are called to trust God even in small steps, to serve faithfully without seeking recognition, and to live courageously through the Spirit's power. May we, like the apostles, ask Christ each day: "Lord, increase our faith," and may our lives reflect a humble, trusting discipleship that draws others closer to Him.
