My dear People of God, *Gratitude* lies at the heart of today's Gospel (Luke 17:11–19). As Jesus heals ten lepers on His journey to Jerusalem, only one—a Samaritan—returns to give thanks and praise to God. All ten are cleansed, but only the one who returns truly experiences the fullness of salvation. *His healing goes deeper than his skin; it transforms his heart.*

This Gospel reminds us that faith and gratitude are inseparable. The grateful heart sees beyond the gift to the Giver. The nine who did not return received a miracle but missed the deeper relationship that Jesus offered. Gratitude opens the door to intimacy with God—it is the language of faith, the breath of love, and the foundation of joy.

The first reading (2 Kings 5:14–17) echoes this same truth. Naaman, a foreigner healed of leprosy, returns to the prophet Elisha to give thanks and to declare his faith in the one true God. Both Naaman and the Samaritan leper reveal that God's mercy knows no boundaries—His grace reaches beyond every barrier of nation, religion, or status.

Saint Paul, writing from prison (2 Timothy 2:8–13), reminds us that even when we are unfaithful, Christ remains faithful. His steadfast love is the ultimate reason for our thanksgiving.

For our parish, this Sunday is a call to live with hearts of gratitude. When we take time to thank God—in the Eucharist, in prayer, and through service—we discover that thanksgiving transforms our vision. We begin to recognize God's presence in every blessing, every trial, every person. Let us be like the Samaritan who turned back, fell at Jesus' feet, and praised God with a loud voice. Gratitude is not just a polite response—it is the posture of a disciple who truly knows the mercy of the Lord.
