My dear People of God, today, the Church throughout the world celebrates World Mission Sunday—a day to remember that every baptized person is called to share in the mission of Christ. This year's readings invite us to deepen our faith, persevere in prayer, and live as witnesses of the Gospel in both word and action.

In the Gospel (Luke 18:1–8), Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow who refuses to give up until justice is granted. Her perseverance reflects the kind of faith every missionary—and indeed every Christian—must have: a faith that does not lose heart, even when results are slow or challenges abound. Mission begins and is sustained in persistent prayer, rooted in trust that God's will is unfolding even when we cannot yet see it. The first reading (Exodus 17:8–13) shows Moses raising his hands in prayer as Israel battles the Amalekites. When his hands grow weary, Aaron and Hur support him, symbolizing the power of community in mission. No one carries the mission alone—we are all co-workers in God's saving plan. Saint Paul, in the second reading (2 Timothy 3:14–4:2), urges us to proclaim the Word "in season and out of season." Every moment, every encounter, is an opportunity to make Christ known through our compassion, our courage, and our joy.

On this Mission Sunday, the Church reminds us that mission is not limited to distant lands—it begins right where we are: in our families, schools, workplaces, and parishes. Each act of kindness, forgiveness, or justice becomes a missionary act when done in Christ's name. Let us pray for all missionaries—those who travel far and those who witness quietly at home. May our parish renew its missionary spirit, praying without ceasing, serving without fear, and loving without measure. For when the Son of Man comes, may He find in us a faith that is living, persevering, and boldly missionary.
