My dear People of God, the Second Sunday of Advent invites us into the heart of the season's meaning: **preparation for the Lord who comes**. Today we hear the powerful voice of John the Baptist, calling from the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths!" His words are not merely a memory from Scripture—they are addressed to us, here and now, in our own spiritual deserts, routines, and responsibilities.

The prophet Isaiah, echoed by John, paints a vision of hope: mountains made low, valleys lifted, crooked ways straightened. These images speak to God's transforming desire for each of us. Advent is not only about preparing our homes for Christmas but preparing our hearts for Christ. Each of us carries "mountains" that need lowering—pride, stubbornness, old resentments—as well as "valleys" that need lifting—discouragement, weariness, wounds we carry quietly. God wants to smooth these places with His mercy.

St. Paul reminds us that the Scriptures were written "for our instruction, so that by endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." Advent hope is not passive waiting; it is the confident expectation that God is at work, even when we do not yet see the final shape of His plan. It is the hope that strengthens families, renews parishes, and draws communities together in love.

John the Baptist's call to repentance is not meant to frighten us but to free us. Repentance simply means turning toward God—again, or even for the first time in a long while. In this season, small steps matter: a moment of prayer in the morning, kindness to a stranger, forgiveness extended, a visit to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a renewed openness to the Holy Spirit. As a parish, we prepare the way of the Lord not only in our church but in the world around us. When we live with expectant hope, quiet trust, and generous love, our parish becomes a living Advent candle—shining Christ's light into the darkness.

May this week awaken in us a deeper longing for Jesus, the One who comes to save, to heal, and to make all things new. *Come, Lord Jesus!*
