My dear People of God, the Gospel today brings us to the hillside where Jesus proclaims the Beatitudes—words we know well, yet ones that quietly overturn the values of the world. ***Blessed are the poor in spirit... the meek... the merciful... the peacemakers.*** This is not a list of admired traits in a culture that prizes strength, success, and self-assertion. And yet, Jesus calls these people blessed.

The Beatitudes are not sentimental ideals or unreachable virtues. They are a portrait of Christ himself. Jesus is poor in spirit, completely trusting the Father. He is meek, gentle of heart, yet unwavering in truth. He mourns with those who suffer, hungers for righteousness, shows mercy without measure, and makes peace through the gift of his very life. To live the Beatitudes, then, is to allow our lives to be shaped into the likeness of Christ.

The first reading from the prophet Zephaniah echoes this call, urging us to seek humility, justice, and refuge in the Lord. God's promise is not rooted in power or prestige, but in a humble people who place their trust in him.

Saint Paul reinforces this message, reminding the Corinthians that God often chooses what the world considers weak or insignificant to reveal his glory.

For us as a parish community, the Beatitudes are both comfort and challenge. They assure us that God is close to those who feel overlooked, weary, or burdened. At the same time, they ask us to examine our priorities. ***Where do we seek our security? Whose voices do we listen to? Do our homes, ministries, and relationships reflect the mercy and peace of Christ?***

Today, Jesus invites us up the mountain—not to escape the world, but to see it differently. May we have the courage to live as Beatitude people, ***trusting that true happiness is found not in having more, but in loving more, for the sake of the Kingdom of God.***
