My dear People of God, on this Solemnity of **the Baptism of the Lord**, the Church invites us to stand on the banks of the Jordan and contemplate a mystery that reveals who Jesus is—and who we are called to be. In the Gospel, we see Jesus steps into the waters not because He needs repentance, but because He chooses solidarity. *The sinless One enters the place of sinners, sanctifying the waters and opening a new path for humanity.*

As Jesus rises from the Jordan, *the heavens are opened, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice is heard: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."* This is not only a revelation of Christ's identity; it is a proclamation spoken over every baptized person. Through our baptism, those same heavens are opened for us. *We are claimed, loved, and sent.*

Isaiah speaks of the Servant who brings justice gently, who does not break the bruised reed or quench the smouldering wick. This is the mission Jesus embraces at His baptism, and it is the mission He shares with us. Baptism is not simply a moment from our past; it is a living reality. It calls us daily to walk as sons and daughters who reflect the Father's mercy, humility, and courage in a wounded world.

St Peter reminds us that God shows no partiality, and that Jesus went about doing good, healing all who were oppressed. *Baptism draws us into this same movement outward—toward service, reconciliation, and hope.*

Today, as we renew our awareness of our baptism, let us remember: *we are beloved before we do anything, and we are sent because we are loved.* May we live as people anointed by the Spirit, unafraid to enter the waters of our world and reveal, by our lives, the face of Christ.
