My dear People of God, on this **Sunday of the Word of God**, the Gospel of Matthew presents the Word not only as something spoken, but as someone who walks into our lives and calls us by name. Jesus begins his public ministry with a simple yet urgent proclamation: **“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”** God’s Word is not distant—it is near, active, and demanding a response.

As Jesus walks along the Sea of Galilee, his Word takes flesh in a call: **“Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men”** Peter, Andrew, James, and John hear only a few words, yet those words are powerful enough to reshape their entire lives. They leave nets, boats, and security behind. This is what the **Word of God** does when it is truly heard—it unsettles, frees, and sends us forward it evokes a **response** from us!

The prophet Isaiah speaks of people walking in darkness who see a great light. That light is Christ himself, present wherever the Word is proclaimed. When Scripture is read in the Church, it is not merely information; it is illumination. The Word reveals where we are clinging to our “nets” and invites us into deeper trust.

This Sunday, established by Pope Francis, reminds us that the Bible must become the heart of our Christian life. The Word we hear at Mass is meant to continue in our homes, our ministries, and our daily decisions.

May we listen today as the first disciples did—with openness and courage. If we allow the Word to take root, our parish will become a place where Christ still walks, still calls, and still makes disciples—today. Yes, he called as to be **‘missionary disciples’** – to be faithful listeners and active respondents; to be with Him and to be sent out!
